Job Description

As a youth worker you will be part of the team at Carney's community, supporting the running of the youth boxing sessions and youth club. You don't need any experience in boxing, but it is a bonus. We are, however, specifically looking for people with experience of working with & supporting young people aged 11-18. We may consider offering paid training in youth work as part of the role.

Duties during Sessions:

1. Support the weekly session of activities including boxing and youth club.
2. Support the holiday activities provided by the organisation, such as extra sessions and trips.
3. Engage with young people during the sessions, supporting them with the activities that are being run, encouraging conversation and directing them to further support when needed.
4. Be proactive and youth-led in coming up with ideas for how to better engage young people in the organisation, particularly the target group of young people the charity aims to support.
5. Work collaboratively and supportively within the to bring a united front to sessions.
6. Attend briefings, de-briefings and ongoing meetings to improve practice and allow space for discussion of sessions.
7. Be consistent in imposing the Carney's Community Code of Conduct within sessions and setting clear boundaries and expectations to young people during sessions.
8. Take registers during sessions, complete contact sheets following sessions and a timesheet each month. Ensure all paperwork is completed and entered directly onto our electronic system.
9. Attend meetings, as requested by your line manager, with external organisations, young people, parents/carers and schools.

General Duties:

1. Attend regular supervision and team meetings as agreed with line manager.
2. Carry out all duties in accordance with Carney's Community's policies, actively safeguarding and promoting equality and seeking to prevent and overcome disadvantage, discrimination & bullying.
3. Ensure that legislation relating to the health safety and protection of young people, staff and the public is complied with at all times.
4. Maintain appropriate boundaries and confidentiality with young people, staff and volunteers.
5. Be fully aware of and understand the duties and responsibilities arising from your role in the organisation regarding safeguarding policies and procedures of the organisation to keep young people and vulnerable adults safe and protected from harm.
6. Be a positive role model to young people during all work done at Carney's Community and behave appropriately when out in the community in order to uphold the positive reputation of the centre.
7. Complete the relevant training and development to fulfil statutory and Carney's Community requirements (e.g. first aid and safeguarding) and be open to ongoing professional development.
8. Carry out any other reasonable duties and responsibilities within the overall function, commensurate with the grading and level of responsibilities of the post.

- JNC qualification in youth work (or willing to work towards)
- One year's youth work experience either paid or voluntary
- Experience of working with hard-to-reach groups
- A knowledge of working with young people involved or at risk of being involved in crime
- A strong interest in the local community, and a willingness to work with colleagues in order to further the positive reputation of the organisation within the community
- Experience of working closely with other sessional youth workers
- Competent with basic IT skills e.g. email, word documents, excel
- Good verbal communication skills
- A good level of Maths and English
- Ability to work in a team along with self-motivation, perseverance and determination
- Ability to communicate at all levels and build relationships quickly
- Well organised, with good timekeeping and able to follow instructions
- Ability to support the aims and purposes of Carney's Community
